Please complete the entry form indicating how many entries are being made for each class.

Entries must be registered in advance (other than for the Children's classes) either on Wednesday, 5th August at the Memorial Hall between 6.30pm and 8.00pm or delivered/posted with payment to Peter Cooke at 2 Hodgson Fold, Addingham, LS29 0HA prior to this date. Entries cannot be accepted after this date or by telephone at any time.

Entry costs are **50p** per exhibit other than for the Children's section, which are free. Prize money will be awarded; 1st £3.00, 2nd £2.00 and 3rd £1.00.

All classes are open to all exhibitors apart from the '**Novice**' classes in the Vegetables and Flowers sections that are intended for those who are new to showing. These classes are to encourage potential new exhibitors to enter the show this year and then, hopefully, become regular participants in the future.

Vegetables

Henderson Cup – Best in Vegetables

Hadley Cup – Best Collection

Peter Hindle Cup - Most points in Vegetables

- 1 Broad Beans (**6** no.)
- 2 Runner Beans (**6** no.)
- 3 Dwarf, French or Climbing Beans (**6** no.)
- 4 Longest Runner Bean (**1** no.)
- 5 Peas with calyx attached (**6** no.)
- 6 Carrots trimmed to 75mm (**3** no.)
- 7 Cabbage either red or green, with stalk attached (**1** no.)
- 8 Courgettes, approximately 150mm in length (**2, a matching pair**)
- 9 Cucumber (**1** no.)
- 10 Marrow with maximum length of 350mm (**1** no.)
- 11 Onions, dressed with maximum weight of 250g each (**3** no.)
- 12 Onions, dressed with minimum weight of 250g each (**3** no.)
- 13 Shallots, displayed on a dish (**6** no.)
- 14 Leeks (**3** no.)
- 15 Potatoes, white (**4** no.)
- 16 Potatoes, coloured (**4** no.)
- 17 Heaviest Potato (**NEW CLASS**)
- 18 Tomatoes, salad or plum, with calyx attached (**4** no.)
- 19 Tomatoes, small fruited, with calyx attached (**6** no.)
- 20 Beetroot, with tops trimmed (**3** no.)
- 21 Rhubarb with 75mm of leaf per stalk (**3** stalks)
- 22 Any other vegetable

- 24 Collection of Vegetables with **6** different varieties with quantities as above, to be displayed on a tray with internal measurements not to exceed 60cm x 60cm.

Fruit

Fruit is to be displayed on paper plates for classes 26 and 27

The Association Fruit Cup - Best in Fruit

- 26 A Plate of ripe Apples, dessert or cooking, with stalk and leaves left on, one variety (**3** no.)
- 27 A Plate of **one variety** of Fruit, excluding apples, with stalk and leaves left on (quantity at exhibitor's discretion)
- 28 A Dish with a selection of Fruit, **with more than one variety**, of the exhibitor's choice

Flowers

Cut flowers are to be displayed in the Association's vases

Ridley Cup - Best in Flower section

Pat McShee Memorial Rose Bowl – Best in Roses

Tom Lancaster Salver – Best in Sweet Peas

- 29 One vase of **5** Dahlias, any mix of varieties
- 30 One vase of **9** Sweet Peas any variety or mix of varieties
- 31 One vase of **5** Sweet Peas, one variety
- 32 One vase of **3** Gladioli spikes
- 33 One vase of **3** Roses of any variety
- 34 One vase of **6** flowering stems of one variety not in classes 29 to 33
- 35 Pot plant, flowering or foliage (17.5cm maximum pot size)
- 36 One vase of mixed flowering stems, with a minimum of **5**, maximum of **10** taken from a **minimum of two** different kinds of plants.
Please note that two varieties of the same plant are not two kinds.
- 37 Herb in a pot
- 38 A jam jar of mixed herbs
- 39 **Novice Class** - Entries from any of the classes 29 to 36 as described above with the quantities as specified

Homecrafts (Jams and Preserves, Baking and Handicrafts)

Society Trophy – Best exhibit in Homecrafts

Jams and Preserves

- 40 One jar of Jam or Jelly Preserve, any variety
- 41 One jar of Lemon Curd
- 42 One jar of Marmalade, any citrus fruit
- 43 One jar of Chutney (**NEW CLASS**)

Baking

The use of electric bread makers is not allowed for class 44
All baking exhibits must be covered with plastic cling film

- 44 One loaf, white or brown, any shape, on a paper plate
- 45 Six breadsticks to be displayed in a beer glass
- 46 A Lemon Drizzle Cake, any shape, on a paper plate
- 47 Four Fruit Scones on a paper plate

Handicrafts

Entries should not have been previously exhibited at an Addingham Village Show

- 48 Any Knitted or Crocheted item of apparel
- 49 Any non-apparel Knitted or Crocheted item
- 50 A piece of Embroidery or Cross Stitch
- 51 A piece of Patchwork or Quilting
- 52 Any other craft of the exhibitor's choice, other than from the classes above, with the size not to exceed 40cms wide, 40cms deep and 40cms high

Floral Art

John Carroll Salver – Best in Class 53

The maximum size of exhibits for classes 53 and 54 is to be 50cms wide, 50cms deep and 60cms high so that they fit within the dimensions of the display niches, which will be set out.

Exhibits may only be moved by the owner, the Show Secretary or class steward.

- 53 A Hand Tied Bouquet in an 'all round' style
- 54 An Arrangement of Flowers in your 'favourite' vase
- 55 A Jam Jar of Garden Flowers with added herbs if desired

Photography

The Elizabeth Powell Photographic Trophy - Best Photograph

Photographs are to be displayed unmounted but may be backed onto card.
The maximum size of photographs is 12" x 8"

- 56 "Something you are Proud of Today"
- 57 "In our Garden"

Children's Section

- 58 Nature in an Egg Box

Find and collect natural treasures from your gardens, the woods, beach or a local walk and arrange these beautifully in an empty cardboard six cup egg box.

All items must be natural objects such as leaves, twigs, feather, shells, stones, seeds and pinecones and no man-made materials such as glue or plastic toys are to be used or added. The lid must be able to be closed without squashing the contents. The judge will be looking for variety of content and creativity.

Entries will be judged and prizes awarded based on the age groups; 4 to 7 and 8 to 11. Entries are free and to be made on the day, between 0830 and 1000, with no requirement to pre-enter.

Show Rules

The show will be conducted in accordance with the following rules;

1. The judges are empowered to withhold any prize for an exhibit not deemed worthy, or for an exhibit entered in the wrong class.
2. The committee shall be empowered to settle any dispute which may arise.
3. Horticultural exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor in their own garden or allotment apart the classes in the Floral Art section.
4. All entries are made at the sole risk of their owners.
5. Prize money must be collected on the day of the show. Any winnings not collected on the day will be deemed to have been donated to the Association's funds.
6. Exhibitors must set up entries for the Flowers classes, in the Association's vases, on the tables provided and not on the show tables.
7. Only two entries per person may be made in each class.
8. Each entry must be entered under one name and joint entries cannot be accepted.

Other Prizes and Trophies

Other prizes and trophies awarded and presented at the Show are:

Banksian Medal, provided by RHS for the most points in the horticultural (vegetable, fruit and flower) classes

The Fleece Cup for the most points in show

Allotment Plate, sponsored by the Parish Council
